## Man arrested in overdose death held for probation violation

A Hoopeston man arrested last week in connection with the death of another Hoopeston man is being held for violation probation.

Thomas Dalton, 20, is being held in the Public Safety Building on \$250,000 bond for allegedly violating probation he received after pleading guilty to burglary last year.

Dalton was arrested Wednesday on preliminary charges of drug induced homicide and delivery of a controlled substance in connection with the death of 18year-old John Morgenroth of Hoopeston.

Mr. Morgenroth was found unresponsive Wednesday morning and was pronounced dead at his home in the 300 block of East Washington. Coroner Peggy Johnson said the suspected cause of death was drug overdose.

Vermilion County State's Attorney Frank Young has not filed charges against Dalton in the case pending the outcome of toxicology reports.

Dalton is expected to be in court June 25 for a petition hearing.

## Hoopeston couple pleads not guilty to unlawful restraint

A Hoopeston couple has pleaded not guilty to charges that they chained their handicapped niece to a bed.

Barbara A. Schwartz, 64, and her husband, Ronald H. Schwartz, 66, both of 724 S. Fourth St., pleaded not guilty Thursday to unlawful restraint, a Class 4 felony, in Vermilion County Circuit Court.

The couple were charged May 16 after police say they had their niece chained to a bed in a second-floor bedroom of their home.

Police discovered the woman, Paula Schwartz, on March 30 after she called for help from a window in the home. A neighbor heard her and called police. According to reports, Ms. Schwartz was home alone with a chain padlocked to her ankle. The bedroom was locked with no doorknob. Inside the room, Ms. Schwartz had a bottle of water and a coffee can to use for toileting.

On April 19, an emergency hearing took guardianship of Ms. Schwartz away from the couple and placed it with the state.

The Schwartzes were named Paula Schwartz' guardian in 1997.

The couple are set to appear at jury trial on Sept. 28.


