Local pipsqueaks don't thwart rehearsal of ART's 'Pippin'

nally broke down and let me have a column of my very own. How cool is that?

As you all know, it's my lot in life to complain about things (hence the title of my column) but to be perfectly contrary, I thought I'd break in my new venture with something nice. Now, don't think I've gone soft because I haven't. It's just that I like to keep people guessing and what better way to do that then by being - dare I say it nice?

I know it's Thursday and you all probably have your weekend all planned, what with Harry Potter and gardening and mowing and what-not, but if you have a couple free hours, it would be worth your while to check out the Artistic Repertory Theatre production of "Pippin."

Lourdine was invited to attend a rehearsal and for some reason, she asked me to go in her place. I mean, what do I know about the arts? The only culture I get is from yogurt, but I couldn't very well tell her no.

I admit, I wasn't looking forward to it. But things looked up when I got to the McFerren Park Civic Center and I saw police there. I figured maybe one of the actors had gone over the edge and I would have a BIG story. As it turned out, some pre-teen girls got into the civic center and damaged some of the costumes and props and apparently stole a few items, too. The cast was pretty upset about it. You could tell they put a lot of

effort into the production and they mad as hornets that a few little hooligans tried to ruin it. Can't say I blame them at all for being upset.

Despite their anger/frustration at the incident, everyone - from director Kathleen Margevich on down pulled themselves together to embody that "the show must go on"

saying. Some of the actors couldn't even wear their costumes because the little pipsqueaks had written on them with lipstick or ripped them or gotten them wet but that didn't phase the cast.

I plunked myself down at a table with Carol and Marty Kloska and, quite frankly, thought I could scribble a few notes about the production and leave. I ended up staying through both acts and the after-rehearsal critique and, I'm sorry to say, I took very few notes because I got so caught up in the action.

"Pippin" is the story of a young prince who is certain there's more to life than what he's experienced because he believes he should lead an extraordinary life.

The original Broadway production included a lot of erotica that you won't see in the local offering, which is quite family-friendly. There are, I think, two scenes with (rather chaste) kisses between characters who are couples but except for a couple double entendres, the local production has nothing racy in it.

What it does have are cast members who turn in solid performances, especially in the vocals department.

Doug Deckard of Rossville is wonderful as Pippin, singing his way through the two-act show. Emily Margevich, who plays a soldier, does double duty as Pippin's grandmother, Berthe. The idea of a young woman playing a grandmother (and doing it so credibly) tickles
