Rossville trustees commit to allowing elevator expansion

ROSSVILLE—Village trustees unanimously made a commitment to the new owners of the town's elevator to allow it to expand.

In a 4-0 vote, trustees made a commitment to approve a conditional use permit for land JBS United hopes to purchase.

The company, which purchased the former Kaufman Grain, wants to buy property currently owned by Robert Danner. The property now has a conditional use permit but that will expire upon sale of the land.

Jason Risley, representing JBS United, said the company intends to put its office and scale on the new property, moving the traffic pattern to the south side of the property, away from the street.

Along with constructing the office and scale, JBS plans to erect a 60-foot bin and is cleaning up the site, Risley said.

Mayor Terry Prillaman encouraged trustees to give the commitment Risley sought. "They're making a big investment down there - over \$1 million." he said.

Trustees Charles Cornell, Mary Beth Rhodes, Nancy Null and Dick Queen voted in favor. Trustees Bunny Tweedy and Tom Gregory were absent.

Risley invited the board to a get-acquainted meeting to be held Tuesday night at Turtle Run Country Club in Danville, where board members could meet Matt Knight who will manage the Rossville facility.

In other discussion, Fred Whitman of East Central Illinois Community Action Program updated the board on the Ridl-Thomas subdivision.

Whitman said Teresa Prim has been hired as a grant writer. She has experience in writing for the Illinois Housing Development Authority and Chicago Home Loan Fund. ECICAA hopes to receive grants of \$40,000 per home from IHDA and \$1,000 each from CHLF.

Additionally, ECICAP will receive a \$5,000-per-home development fee.



The homes are intended for families with incomes of \$32,000 or less and will include three bedrooms and two baths. Square footage, originally set at 1,300, may have to be lowered to 1,265 to keep costs down, Whitman said, adding the target per-home selling price is \$80,000.

Whitman said the agency has prepared a presentation on the property, which it has shown to others. "People who have seen it are impressed with the area," he said.

ECICAP's option on the property expires in October.

In other business, the board:

- Approved a \$46,537 bid from Daniel Ribbe Construction for street repairs. The bid is 7.5 percent over the engineering estimate and was the sole bid received. Of the total, \$22,000-\$24,000 will be paid from Tax Increment Financing funds and the rest from Motor Fuel Tax money.
- Tabled a proposed ordinance regarding towing and

seizing vehicles, as well as changes in the utility deposits ordinance.

- Heard from Cornell about the need to clean the area around the village pond. Cornell said he is also investigating what types of fish may be stocked in the pond.
- Will seek bids on extending Summit from Thompson to Earl Court. Village workers may do most of the work, as time permits.
- Heard from Dennis and Caroline Barragree and Judy Rayfield disputing news reports that Rossville residents welcomed Witch School to their town.

The school recently moved from Hoopeston to Rossville, at 117 S. Chicago.
