Grant Township soon to take over rural Thompson Avenue

County road crews are expected to soon begin seal coating Thompson Ave., from Hoopeston's city limits to Chenevville Rd.

At Tuesday's Grant Township Board meeting, Road Commissioner Gary Weinard said county workers will begin work on the project soon, in preparation for turning the road over to the township.

Weinard said the road will not be as nice as some other township roads. "I can't say I'm extremely pleased with the surface of the road," he told trustees, adding there was nothing that could be done about the matter.

The addition of the road will add approximately 3.5 miles to roads overseen by the township road crew.

A county crew will also be tar and chip sealing Antioch Road, but that road will remain with the county.

In other business, Supervisor Bill Boose said repairs to the Lincoln St. CSX crossing in Hoopeston had been expected to be completed before Labor Day but work was not started until Monday. "It seems like we always have one crossing closed (for the Labor Day holiday)," he said. Crews are also expected to repair the siding on the Thompson Ave. crossing.

The board briefly discussed an ongoing matter concerning a request from the Hoopeston Fire Department to increase the amount it pays for fire protection in rural Grant Township from \$13,000 to \$30,000 per year.

Boose told trustees he wrote to state Rep. Shane Cultra about the situation. In his letter, Boose told Cultra that rural township residents may not be billed for fire calls because they are taxed for fire protection and wondered if it might not be prudent for the fire department to bill homeowners for calls and the bills be forwarded to the company providing home insurance.
