Leaders across region to discuss changing economic trends

The State of Working Illinois: Challenges and Opportunities community forum will bring together key leaders in East Central Illinois to discuss the significant changes taking place in the regional and state economy. East Central Illinois faces significant economic changes that most of the state and nation are grappling with. These changes include a shrinking manufacturing base, a growing low-wage service sector and a demand for a skilled workforce in critical sectors.

Community leaders will address issues of education and training, job quality and workforce well-being, and will brainstorm around new and innovative ways that local partners can work together in order to ensure that the East Central region has skilled workers, a strong economy and a thriving community in the 21st century.

The Forum, State of Working Illinois: Challenges and Opportunities, is being held at the University of Illinois Extension - Vermilion County, 12190 U.S. Route 150 in Oakwood from 3-5 p.m. and is a collaborative effort between the Vermilion County Workforce Investment Board (VCWIB), the Center for Tax and Budget Accountability and the Illinois Works for the Future Campaign.

In addition to bringing together key leaders in the re-

gion, today's Community Forum will also feature information from The State of Working Illinois report, authored by the Center for Tax and Budget Accountability and Northern Illinois University, which, for the first time in Illinois, tracks economic and workforce trends across regions and throughout the state.

These economic trends are not unique to East Central Illinois. From 1990 to 2005, Illinois lost 24.3% of its manufacturing jobs while three service industries (professional and business services, education and health services, and the leisure and hospitality industry) registered a 37.1percent increase. All three of these highgrowth service sector jobs pay less than the jobs being replaced.

The State of Working Illinois: Challenges and Opportunities will discuss issues of education and training, job quality and workforce well-being, and opportunities to work together in new ways in an effort to ensure that the East Central Illinois region has skilled workers, a strong economy and thriving community.
