City business owners address council about liquor licenses

Frank Smith, owner of Sav-U-Mor Food Store, wants to make sure that if a "big box" store comes to Hoopeston, it won't be put higher on the list of businesses requesting a liquor license than his is.

Smith, along with owners of Hoopeston Convenience Store and Hoop Shell, spoke at Tuesday night's Hoopeston City Council meeting about liquor licenses for their businesses.

Smith said having a liquor license might improve his business and that the city would also benefit by increased sales tax revenue. "The city could help us grow in the community," he said.

Smith said Walmart is his biggest competitor. "They buy liquor licenses just like that," he said, snapping his fingers. Walmart is building smaller stores in smaller communities, he said, seeking assurance that such a store would not be granted a license before his store would be.

Kenneth Gomes, owner of the Shell station, said most of his customers come off of Rtes. 1 and 9. Gomes said the inability to sell liquor means he is losing inside sales, as customers who would buy chips and other snacks, fail to do so when they cannot also buy alcohol.

Gomes said that about two weeks ago, a woman wanted to purchase alcohol but since he has not available, "I had to guide her to the next business in town," he said. "People want to do all their business in one place and will go to the store that carries (everything)."

Convenience has a beer and wine license but owner Rocky Palak said he would also like to sell hard liquor.

"There is not strong sentiment on the council to change the number of liquor licenses," Alderman Bill Crusinberry told the men.

Crusinberry said the council examined the ordinance which lists the numbers and types of each classification of liquor license. Changing the number of licenses would require changing the ordinance, but, he said, the number should be increased only if the community feels more are needed, not because business owners want licenses. "There's a lot of businesses selling liquor in town," he added.

In unrelated discussion, Crusinberry said the water department is experiencing problems with the electronic starter on one of its four pumps.

Also, Hoopeston is taking part in a water consumption survey being conducted by an east central Illinois regional planning group. The survey, which is expected to take about a year, is being done in Chicago and the collar counties and some communities on the Mahomet aquifer, including Hoopeston and Watseka. The survey is in response to Chicago officials who wanted to implement water-related rules that would have cost people in downtstate Illinois, he said.

In other business, the council:

Heard from economic developer Shannon Ruh about a town meeting at 7 p.m. Wednesday at St. Anthony parish hall to review the work of recent mapping sessions. Everyone is invited to attend the meeting. Refreshments will be served.

Heard from Alderman Carl Ankenbrand that part of the fence on the north side of McFerren Park will be replaced by Alvin Fence Company. Next year's budget is expected to include funds to replace the rest of the fence.

Discussed the hanging of banners and Christmas decorations. Mayor Bill DeWitt asked for and was given permission to find people willing to do the work.

Unanimously approved Barbara "Bobbie" Redden as a new auxiliary police officer.

Heard a letter from Jeanne Lotz about conditions at the civic center, including wiring issues and problems in the


