Help asked for Darfur situation

For the past few years, I've been following the crisis in the Darfur region of the Sudan. American media rarely covers the genocide (systematic murder of an entire race of people) that's been happening there for the past four years. I've written letters to Senators Obama and Durbin and even called the White House to voice my opinion. Now, as a volunteer with a nonprofit organization called LifeNets, I've been invited to meet with Senators in Washington, D.C. on October 3 to deliver the letters we have collected in support of a no-fly zone over Darfur.

The trip, generously sponsored by author Christopher Kush, is a wonderful opportunity and our efforts may be covered by Fox News, CNN, and Good Morning America. I was shocked to receive the invitation, and it made me realize that I am living proof that we can all make a difference. Born and raised in Hoopeston, I now reside in the even smaller town of Tuscola. From my home office in this small town I was able to collect more than 800 personal responses from people around the country.

Now, I'd like to ask for the support of Hoopeston residents. We are just shy of the 10,000 letters we need (100 for each senator). Additionally, if anyone has family or friends in Alabama, responses from that state will be particularly helpful, as Alabama's Senator Shelby has the ability to fast-track the Darfur Accountability and Divestment Act so that it goes to a vote before the Senate adjourns in November. I am not a politician. I simply speak from my heart. You can do the same as you answer the survey. Please support the hometown girl in my efforts to save the world—or at least part of it. And watch for me Wednesday, October 3. Wish me luck, and hope that I don't get tongue-tied!

Hoopeston Area Girls Cross Country team follows in footsteps of 2006 winning season

The Hoopeston Area Girls Cross Country team is finding their stride again this year. They repeated as champions of the Bismark Invitational on Sept 13 and finished sixth in the 32 school meet at Spartan Classic in St Joe invitational on Sept 22 (last year they finished eleventh).

Last Saturday, they repeated as champions of the Thunder Run Invitational a 14-school event at Kickapoo State Park hosted by Salt Fork. The Thunder Run

was the first big meet the girls won in 2006. The Thunder Run is not scored in the traditional manner but instead the finishing times are all added together for the team results.

This year Hoopeston Area defeated the closest competitor, Villa Grove, by more than six minutes. Erika Ramos was the first place medalist with a personal best time at Kickapoo of 19:40. Belinda Cohen was 5th overall with a time of 20:44. Abby Newman finished 15 in 22:39, Emily Warner was 19th in 23:35, and Ashley Houmes was 20th in 23:40.

The boys team didn't have enough members to compete as a team but the individuals run very well. Freshman Jeff Hendricks finished 61st with a time of 22:15 followed by William Plaza 69th in 23:47, Evan Pierce was 71st in 24:09 and Vincent Watson was 74th in 24:10.

Our next meet is Thursday at PBL in Paxton which will be an 8 team event called the Mid Season Run. It will begin at 4:30 behind the PBL High School.
