Preliminary results given from Hoopeston housing survey

The Hoopeston housing taskforce distributed 2,400 surveys. The committee received a 34% response rate from the community, with 826 completed surveys.

Approximately 154 surveys were either not picked up, vacant homes, or the survey was denied by the property owner. Sixty Eight percent of individuals completing the survey have lived in Hoopeston more than 20 years. Some preliminary results include: Does Hoopeston need more rental


