Rumors of 'super bug' staph infection in high school false

Last week, rumors spread through Hoopeston Area High School that someone was infected with MRSA, Methacillin-Resistant Staphlococcus aureus, a drugresistant staph infection.

Principal Larry Maynard addressed the issue at Thursday's board meeting. "Things were spinning in a negative direction," he told the board adding that no students have the infection.

Information was given to staff and students about MRSA. And while no students at Hoopeston have been reported to have MRSA, the bacteria has been found in some Vermilion County patients.

Below is information provided by Hoopeston Regional Health Center about the infection.

Staphlococcus aureus is a germ commonly carried in the nose and on the skin of healthy people. MRSAs cannot be killed by certain antibiotics which are commonly used to treat staph.

Most infections caused by staph are skin infections, such as pimples or boils. Infections can be red, painful, swollen or have pus or other drainage. More serious staph infections can also cause pneumonia and infections of the blood and joints.

Staph is spread by improperly washed hands; contact with secretions from infected skin lesions, wounds and nasal discharge; objects and surfaces contaminated with staph; and through crowded living conditions, which can spread staph or MRSA among family members, children and athletes.

To stop the spread of MRSA, wounds should be kept covered if they have pus or are draining. Bandages and tape may be thrown away with regular trash.

The best way to help stop the spread of MRSA is for people to wash their hands with soap and water, especially after changing a bandage. Alcohol-based hand gel may be used when soap and water are unavailable.

According to information from the Mayo Clinic, MRSA is dangerous but can be treated. Instead of broad-spectrum antibiotics normally used to treat many infections, vancomycin is often used.

However, some vancomycin-resistant bacteria have been seen so some health care providers have begun treating the lesions by draining them, rather than with drugs.
