I am writing to respond to the recent letters concerning Emergency Department (ED) physician staffing at Hoopeston Regional Health Center.

I have been criticized for somehow being personally responsible for declining healthcare at the hospital. Instead of just leveling charges on an emotional level or responding in kind to what has been said, let's set some of the facts straight and let the reader decide.

When we were asked to staff the ED at Hoopeston a little over four years ago, admissions were at an all time low of just over 200 annually. The hospital board realized something needed to be done. It seemed another rural hospital was slowly losing its patient base to the larger surrounding hospitals. Since Hoopeston Emer-
