Former resident wonders 'what now?'

I just returned to my home in Colorado Springs after spending Thanksgiving week with my dad and my family in Hoopeston. I had a great time with my family. I have to say, however, that I am concerned about my hometown. I graduated from Hoopeston-East Lynn High School in 1977. I left for the navy shortly after high school. I retired from the navy in 1997 and have lived all over the western United States. I have always known that Hoopeston was a great place to be from.

In many respects, Hoopeston is still a great place to be from. But after being there this past week, I am concerned, as I am sure many people with family in Hoopeston are. My concern is what happens now? To say that there isn't much happening in Hoopeston is an understatement. Hoopeston, Rossville to the south, and Milford to the north are living examples of what has happened to small town America. I don't need to remind anyone that when I graduated from high school in 1977, there were two canning factories, a factory that made cans, a foundry, a vibrant and growing downtown, two motels, three grocery stores, and many other local businesses that were not only surviving--but thriving. A fairly easy commute to Danville could provide a wealth of opportunity for anyone willing to work. I know that what I have described is the Hoopeston of the past and will never be back. But my concern still has some validity.

So here is my concern in the form of a question: My dad is the last member of my immediate family left in Hoopeston. After he is gone, why should I return? I have good memories of Hoopeston, but it is surely not the place I grew up in. Life goes on and things change, we all know that, but my thoughts are still on the idea that I can't really go home again.

My thinking is sentimental of course, but from a practical standpoint, what is in Hoopeston that would cause me to come there if I don't have family in the area? There is no motel; there are not any tourist attractions to speak of; there isn't any fishing or hunting close by. If I wanted to move there permanently, what could I do for a living? It seems time and opportunity have passed Hoopeston by. From a sentimental point of view, that makes me a little sad; from a practical standpoint it begs the question, what happens now?
