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City council hears pitch about community liaison position

If some Vermilion County officials have their way, the state's attorney's office will have a new employee.

Jim McMahon, Vermilion County Board chairman, and Bill Donahue, county finance committee chairman, attended Tuesday night's Hoopeston City Council meeting to pitch a plan that would create a community liaison position within the state's attorney's office.

According to the men, a person hired under the proposed Community Prosecution and Neighborhood Liaison Program would work with police and community leaders in each Vermilion County community to prioritize reaction to crimes in those communities.

Both men said there is a need to do something to help communities deal with crimes and criminals particular to the communities.

"The assessed value of Vermilion County is falling at a rapid rate," McMahon said, citing blight and violence

as two reasons for the decline. He said that violent crime is 18 percent more likely to occur in Vermilion County than any other county in Illinois. Senior citizens are three times more likely to be involved in a violent crime than any other county, while county young people have a 90 percent change of being involved with violent crime than other counties. "We have it," he said. "The crime is real. The depreciation of neighborhoods is happening."

Donahue said "the character of our community has changed over the years. We want to try to make sure every



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community gets the quality of life it deserves."

Under the proposal, the liaison would work with each community in assessing crimes and those which should be prosecuted. The liaison would then handle cases and report back to community committees with updates.

Donahue estimated the position would pay about \$50,000.

The men are going to Vermilion County communities to drum up support before approaching the county board with the plan. McMahon said a nod for funding would be more likely if widespread community support could be shown to the county board.

City attorney Paul Manion, agreeing with the concept, suggested the city hold off on supporting the plan until it has been run by all state's attorney candidates.

Donahue is one of four people looking to replace incumbent Frank Young, who is not running for reelection.

McMahon said he would work on Manion's request and in conversation after the meeting, said Hoopeston was the only community to question the proposal.

In other business, the council heard from economic developer Shannon Ruh that the city has received a draft No Further Remediation (NFR) letter from the EPA for property at the corner of Rtes. 1 and 9.

Officials submitted a plan to the EPA to fix a potential ground water problem at the site. The plan calls for the

capping of wells on adjacent properties, a groundwater ordinance and drilling of a new well for one property

The draft letter supports the plan and will allow remediation to begin on the site, along with installing city water lines. Ruh said.

When Hoopeston receives the final NFR letter, it can market the property for a motel, she added.

Bhupendra Naik, a Danville motel owner, had signed an agreement with the city to build a motel there. However, that agreement has expired and Naik has not renewed it. While he is considering other sites for a motel, he has not ruled out Hoopeston, Ruh said.

In unrelated business, the council:

- Heard a presentation from the Mayor's Youth Council about the Governor's Hometown Award the group won
- Heard from Alderman Carl Ankenbrand that the highside estimated cost for the skate park design at Northside (Cheese) Park is \$65,000, including labor. The estimate includes a 60'x60' plaza, with a four inch concrete pad, 24" platforms, 48" piers, steps, side rails and sidewalks.
- In related business, Ankenbrand tabled two bids for rewiring the Hoopeston Civic Center, citing a \$10,000 difference between them.

The city received two bids, from Gene Roach of Rossville and Kenny McVicker.
