> While Streff said the project is "not a total panacea for all the flooding that occurs in that northeast area," Mayor Bill DeWitt said the work will make a "big, big difference to people who live on Honeywell, Seminary and McCracken. We're definitely going to have some relieve from flooding."

> Hoopeston resident Jean Minick said she's "excited" about the project. Minick, who owns the former Lester's Drugstore building on Main, said heavy rains have flooded the building's basement since the 1970s, causing her to have to repair the structure's furnace. The addition of the detention pond may mean less flooding at her building and others in the downtown.

> Also, Minick said, Ameren has offered to televise sewer tiles going from each business in the area to determine where each goes. "They're being good neighbors," she said.

> The council voted 5-0 to allow the project. Voting were aldermen Charles Davis, Jerry Yonkers, Bill Crusinberry, Bill Goodwine and Brandon Hamilton. Absent were Ed Lotz, Carl Ankenbrand and Nancy Stipp.



Also by a 5-0 vote, the city approved allowing Ameren to seek an EPA permit for the city to treat up to \$250,000 gallons of wastewater. If rainwater collects in the excavation, it will have to be treated because it will be in contact with low levels of petroleum hydrocarbon contaminants, Streff said.

At most, Ameren will send 10,000 gallons per day, 100 gallons a minute to the treatment plant. The plan is temporary, "if they even do it at all," he said.

Currently, Ameren is paying a private company to pump water from the site.
