Former resident one of two men murdered in Edgar County

A former Hoopeston man and his friend were murdered Monday night.

Mark E. Prasse, 32, of rural Chrisman, formerly of Hoopeston, was identified as one of the victims, along with Ryan M. Riddell, 32, of Villa Grove.

According to published reports, the bodies of the men were found in the home of one of them at 10:20 p.m. Monday. They were found after Mr. Riddell's mother telephoned the Edgar County Sheriff's Department after

her son did not arrive home. Police said Mr. Riddell was giving Mr. Prasse a ride home.

Illinois State Police at Pesotum have been asked to help investigate the deaths. Anyone with information is asked to call the Edgar County Sheriff's Department at (217) 465-4166.

Friends and classmates remembered Mr. Prasse Tuesday as someone who was very involved in high school musical activities and someone who loved life.

Hoopeston gathers to award those who serve community

Sometimes, those who do good things for the community get the recognition they deserve.

That was the case Monday, when Hoopeston gathered to honor those who help the community at the annual Community Awards Banquet.

The event includes honors from the Hoopeston Chamber of Commerce, Hoopeston Education Association, Hoopeston Police and Fire departments, Chronicle and Hoopeston Jaycees.

Winners included:

Officer of the Year, Ron Cade, awarded by Police Chief Mark Drollinger. In hiring Cade, the police commission chose someone who was "not your typical hire" because Cade is older than most first-time officers and also had more self-confidence. Drollinger cited Cade's "amazing" monthly statistics and "thorough" reports as showing dedication to his job.

Fireman of the Year: the entire Hoopeston Fire Department. Firemen were on a training exercise and unable to attend the event.

EMT of the Year, Ben Farney, who was chosen not only by ambulance personnel but also coworkers at Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital, said Jackie Johnson, hospital Chief Clinical Officer. Johnson said

Farney has a positive attitude and is a good team player who treats patients with kindness and respect.

Citizen of the Year, Lou Graham. Presented by Bertha Parsons of the Chronicle, the award honors someone who has lifted up Hoopeston in the preceding year. Graham was honored for her work as director of the Hoopeston Public Library. Graham, along with WILL-TV, worked on a special about WWII and the internment camps in Hoopeston. She was also instrumental in the "Hoopeston at Mid-Century" video series and the library expansion program.

Hall of Fame, Dorothy Metz, for her work in bringing to fruition the Hoopeston Multi Agency's community room, which is named in Metz' honor. The award, also presented by Parsons, took note of Metz' role with the Multi Agency, where she also started the thrift shop which not only provides income to the agency but is a place where items are often not sold but given to those who need them.

Burt Livingston Community Award, Mark Drollinger. The award, presented by Pat Bailey, president of the United Community Fund of Grant Township, honors a member of the group for their efforts towards the group.
