weather or for incidents such as school lockdowns, said Superintendent Hank Hornbeck. Hornbeck hopes to have representatives of that com-

pany and a second, ParentReach, provide information to the board about their services.

Generally, both systems broadcast a pre-recorded message to call lists, Hornbeck said. In case of weatherrelated dismissal or other incident, the system would automatically call the homes of students and staff with the message. Up to five numbers per family may be dialed, including land line and cell phone numbers, he said.

Hornbeck estimated the cost of such a program at about \$1 per head or about \$1,500 annually. "That's a pretty good investment in the safety of our kids," he said.

The former allows a parent who feels the district is unsafe to send his student to another school; the second would allow parents to request a student be allowed to attend a different district if state standards are not met for a specific time period.

• Approved forming basketball programs for fifth and sixth grade girls and boys.
