Results of last year's housing survey revealed at meeting

Results of a housing survey conducted last August have been tabulated and were discussed at a sparselyattended meeting Tuesday night.

Of 2,400 surveys distributed, 826 were completed for a response rate of about 34 percent. Of those responding, 68.4 percent have lived in Hoopeston for more than 20 vears.

The survey was done to learn the needs of Hoopeston residents for affordable housing, which is defined as housing that costs no more than 30 percent of a family's income. Families spending more than 30 percent are considered to experience cost burden.

Included in the figure are rent and costs for electric, gas and water or, for those buying a home, mortgage payments, taxes and insurance, along with electric, gas and water bills.

The average income for Vermilion County is about \$49,000. Hoopeston's median income is about 65 percent of that or \$32,000. According to Housing and Urban Development guidelines, families at the 60 percent level who pay more than \$705 (including utilities) per month in housing costs for a two-bedroom apartment or house experience cost burden.

Using survey data, officials hope to entice a developer to consider Hoopeston as a place to build affordable housing, said Economic Developer Shannon Ruh. A developer would perform a feasibility study in the community before moving ahead with any project, she added.

Affordable housing built - or revamped from existing structures - would offer incentives to the developer rather than tenants and would be for low-income families where at least one member is employed. A housing manager would screen potential tenants, who would have to meet strict criteria to get in and stay in the units.
