Community Bank's Wellington branch to close July 18

WELLINGTON—After more than 90 years in business, the Wellington branch of Community Bank will close its doors this summer.

The closing was announced to customers in a letter from bank President and CEO Bill Nicholls. According to the letter, the bank's board of directors decided "that it is no longer economically feasible to operate and maintain" the facility at 222 E. Main St., Wellington.

The facility will close permanently at 5:01 p.m. on

July 18. After that date, customers may make transactions at either Community Bank's main office, at 221 Bank St., Hoopeston or the facility at Rtes. 1 and 9, Hoopeston.

Two employees, Louise Barten of Hoopeston and Sue Williamson of Prairie Green, will transfer to the Hoopeston facility, Nicholls said.

Originally called The Wellington Bank, the facility opened in 1913, when Isaac E. Merritt and Mark R. Koplin formed the Merritt and Koplin Banking Company. Merritt put \$5,000 of his own money in a safe in Alex Pate's store as the original capital and began doing business on May 8. The bank was chartered in October 1913.

A year later, the name was changed to The Wellington State Bank and it was relocated in a new building on the south side of Main Street, where it has remained.

Merritt was its first president and later became the bank's first chairman of the board, an office he held until his retirement in 1946. Murry F. Merritt, his nephew, served as cashier from the bank's inception until his death in 1948.

According to information provided by Nicholls, in 1918,

the bank's resources were \$120,210.57. At the end of the third quarter of 2003, when the bank celebrated its 90th anniversary, resources totaled \$75,840,000.

According to records, the bank was robbed once, in 1921, when thieves broke into the bank and blew the safe door off, making off with lock boxes. After the excitement, the vault was given two safe doors, one inside the other.

A second robbery attempt was planned on Oct. 24, 2001 when a trio of Hoopeston men planned to commit the crime. Hoopeston police were alerted and, after a chase, captured the men before they reached Iroquois County.

In the fall of 1948, Murry Merritt died. Robert Holden was named the new cashier and one day found a \$25 bag of pennies under the safe in the vault. The money was not accounted for and so was given to Grace Merritt, Murry's widow. She purchased a bond with the money and years later, the FBI became interested in the bond and came to Wellington for information. By that time, the bond had been cashed.

However, according to legend, (as handed down by Robert Totheroh) an FBI agent spotted a \$20 bill on the floor and took it, saying it was counterfeit.

The bank expanded to Hoopeston with the facility at

Rtes. 1 and 9 and, in 1986, the bank sold from the main shareholders to Coyn Richardson of Charleston. The next year, the name changed to Community Bank, with the main bank located in a new building on Bank St. At this time, the Wellington facility was made smaller but remained in the same building that housed it since 1914.
