Yonkers also asked the council to consider purchasing a different street sweeper. He presented several options to the council, including a new machine \$155,000 with a \$15,000 trade-in for the city's current sweeper; a new model for \$140,000 with no interest or payments for 12 months; a two-year-old model for \$122,000, and a 2003 reconditioned version for \$60,000, with a six month warranty.

Yonkers said the city's current, 13-year-old model broke again but was repaired by city employees. "It's almost 'fix or repair daily," he told the council, asking that the issue be put on the agenda for the next meeting.

Yonkers was unhappy that a sweeper was not included in the 2008-09 budget passed at a special council meeting last Tuesday. He said after that meeting that his department has enough money accrued to buy a street sweeper; however, at a budget session of the council held April 22, the council cut the sweeper from the budget, concerned that other equipment in the department might need to be replaced. An extra \$15,000 was added to Yonkers' budget to cover street sweeper repairs.
