Scores turn out for annual Memorial Day remembrance

Serving in Iraq gave a man with area connections a new take on Memorial Day.

Ret. Capt. John Arends, whose wife Jane is the daughter of Bob and Betty Brown, served for 24 years in the National Guard and Reserves. But the meaning of Memorial Day did not hit home until a tour of duty in Iraq. Serving as acting company commander, Arends lost two men in the war. "Memorial Day takes on a whole new meaning," he told those gathered at Monday's Memorial Day service at Floral Hill Cemetery.

For those who ask why the U.S. is in Iraq, Arends said the question is not why, but "what is our mission? We're going to go over there and accomplish the mission, whatever the price."

America "has the greatest military in the world," Arends said, praising those who made the ultimate sacrifice, laying down their lives for "their comrades and this country."

Arends urged people to stand behind the troops. "When you forget about your soldiers, then that nation is lost."

The service also included speeches from representatives of the American Legion and VFW auxiliaries, 21 gun salute from the VFW and American Legion rifle corps and patriotic music from the Hoopeston Area High School band.
