### County health department readies for mosquito season

Cool temperatures in the area have delayed the kickoff for West Nile virus prevention efforts in Vermilion County, but public health officials say they are getting ready for mosquitoes that accompany hot weather.

West Nile is transmitted by the bite of mosquitoes that picked up the virus feeding on infected birds.

Vermilion County received \$9,000 from the Illinois Department of Pubic Health for West Nile virus prevention in 2008. With the money, the health department offered training this spring to all local townships so employees could learn how to appropriately apply larvacide packets to standing water, reducing opportunities for mosquito breeding in communities. Only four townships accepted that training.

"We also are preparing to put out gravid traps across the county to collect mosquitoes for testing," said Kolby Riggle, VCHD environmental health director. Additionally, the health department will begin collecting dead birds for testing June 1. "It has really been too cool yet to collect and test dead birds for West Nile," Riggle said, "but we welcome calls from people across the county to let us know about the locations of dead birds so that we can track the development of the virus and potential problem areas in the county, whether we send the birds in for testing or not." Funding only allows 10 birds to be sent to state labs for testing this year. Collecting mosquitoes and testing dead birds for West Nile allows health officials to track development of the virus.

Beginning June 1, anyone who finds a dead bird that has not suffered from any apparent animal attack or that is in a state of decomposition can call the health department at 431-2662. Only a limited number of the following birds will be accepted for testing: blue jays, crows, grackles, starlings, sparrows, finches, robins, cardinals, flycatchers, swallows, catbirds, mockingbirds, warblers, and wrens.


