City council approves redevelopment agreement for motel

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Construction of a motel in Hoopeston took two steps forward. At Tuesday night's meeting,

the Hoopeston City Council approved a redevelopment agreement with Shailesh Patel. who plans to develop a motel on the corner of Rtes. 1 and 9. Under the agreement, Patel will be eligible to recoup 60

Economic developer leaving to accept position in Peoria

Economic developer Shannon Ruh will leave Hoopeston in early July to take a position as an urban planner in Peoria.

Ruh came to Hoopeston about two and a half years ago as a Peace Corps Fellow for economic development, then transitioned into the economic developer, a position she has held for a year and a half.

Ruh, who attended Tuesday's

Hoopeston City Council meeting, teared up as the council voted on her resignation. "This was not an easy decision to make," she said.

Ruh's last day will be July 3. She will begin her new position on July 7. Ruh's master's degree is in planning so the new job will allow her to learn more about city planning and Geographical Information Systems (GIS), creating maps.

During Ruh's stay in Hoopeston, she has been instrumental in working on the motel development for Rtes. 1 and 9, along with the opening of several new businesses, including Papa's Restaurant, Café Delights and Action Travel. She has helped lay the groundwork for future development and improvement, including a south rail site for possible industrial development.
