Dickenson, of Florida, said some residents had negative comments about the colors last week but have rave reviews this week.

This is the first major change to the exterior that Dickenson, who co-owns the building with his wife, Karen Hoth, has done since buying the building about three years ago. "I've made other improvements but you couldn't tell by looking from the outside," he said. "This is a real bang for the buck."

Van Buren Painting of Danville is doing the painting. Owner Greg Van Buren said he, too, heard less-thanpositive comments last week but all positive comments this week.

Tuesday morning, employees Jason Reynolds and Jake Rushin, in a hydraulic lift, applied the burgundy color to the building's top floor, while Van Buren did touch-up work atop a ladder.

Chuck Eldridge rounds out the crew. Not fond of heights, Eldridge, nicknamed "Diesel," does ground work and runs the equipment.

Painting is scheduled to be completed next Wednesday but may be delayed if forecasted rain hits this week.

Part of the cost of the project will come from the city's façade improvement program. Dickenson's application was approved May 6. Under the grant, Dickenson can recoup up to \$5,000 of the \$10,500 cost.

While most of the building is cranberry bog with tan trim, the Country Insurance building has been painted tan. The overpass between the McFerren and Willdon buildings are to be painted a deep green.

Hoopeston's new sweeper delivered, ready to hit the streets

Hoopeston's streets may soon be as clean as its new street sweeper.

The 2008 Elgin Pelican model was delivered to the city street and alley department Tuesday morning and department workers couldn't be happier.

The white sweeper has special paint to resist corrosion and reduce the amount of dirt that will stick to it, said James Bone, sales representative for Key Equipment of Bloomington, where the sweeper was purchased.

Additional features include an air-conditioned cab and rear camera.

The model is one of the first of newly-designed sweepers. Elgin began the redesign in 2001, completing

it last year, in time to produce this year's models.

This is the first new sweeper the city has owned. It replaces a 1995 model that had to be repaired daily, said Wade Gocking, Street and Alley Superintendent, adding he was not sorry to see the old one go.

The city paid about \$145,000 for the new sweeper and received a \$15,000 trade-in for the old model.

Getting the sweeper approved by the council was one of the last acts the late Alderman Jerry Yonkers did before his death on June 20. Department employees, as well as Bone, thought about Mr. Yonkers Tuesday when the machine was delivered. "He worked really hard to get this," Bone said. "I was sorry to hear about what happened."
