thoughts on medical care.

Born in Memphis, Tenn., Rowe received his medical degree from the University of Southern California. His orthopedic surgery training was done at Mayo Clinic Graduate School of Medicine in Rochester, Minn. He returned to San Diego, Calif., where he has practiced orthopedic surgery, specializing in joint replacement surgery, and sports injuries, for the last 18 years.

Rowe, 53, said he "became disenfranchised" practicing medicine in San Diego, where doctors were forced to compromise on how patients were treated. Reimbursements driven by managed care, limitations on tests and what drugs could be prescribed and increasing pressure to see more and more patients, spending less and less time with each one, caused Rowe to start looking at different opportunities.

What he wanted was a place to practice in a community of 100,000 to 150,000 people and he interviewed at about 20 healthcare facilities. Someone suggested he take a look at Gibson Area Hospital, even though Gibson City, at little more than 3,000 people, met his criteria for the size of community in which he planned to live.

Rowe did, and in April, opened a practice there. "I was

truly impressed by the support of the community for the hospital," he said. The staff there supports the administration and the facility supports the community.

At Gibson Area Hospital, Rowe can get to know his patients, their family stories and healthcare needs. He hopes to do the same at Hoopeston Regional Health Center, which, like Gibson Area, is managed by Quorum Health Resources.

In leaving California, Rowe left behind three grown daughters, Brittany, who attended UCLA on an athletic scholarship and who was a member of the school's water polo team that earned four national championships and two undefeated seasons; Emily, who is attending culinary school in San Francisco; and Carly, a freshman at San Diego State, who "has the gift of diplomacy."

Rounding out the family is Cierra, who turned 13 Tuesday.

Plans call for Rowe to be in Hoopeston one half day each week to start, although a schedule has not yet been set
