## Lack of attendance causes no action at city council meeting

The audience far outweighed officials at what was supposed to be Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting.

Fourteen people sat in the audience, but only four officials - including Mayor Bill DeWitt and aldermen Brandon Hamilton, Bill Crusinberry and Ed Lotz - attended.

The lack of a quorum meant no action could be taken on agenda items, including passing the appropriations ordinance and a request from Rankin officials to take part in Hoopeston City Court.

The appropriations ordinance, which lists how the city can spend the \$2,307,986 budget passed in April, plus an extra five percent across-theboard for contingencies, must be approved in July.

A public hearing held prior to the non-meeting brought no questions or comments on the appropria-

Also scheduled for Tuesday's meeting was approval of a request from Rankin officials to participate in Hoopeston City Court.

Rankin had taken part in Vermilion County Night Court but the board approved switching to Hoopeston.


