Rossville trustees unanimously approve stabilization work

ROSSVILLE—Let the work begin!

The Rossville Village Board, at a special meeting Thursday night, unanimously approved a stabilization plan for six village-owned buildings downtown.

Work will start at the former village office at 113 E. Attica, followed by 114, 116 and 118 E. Attica, said Mayor Terry Prillaman. Structures at 115 and 117 E. Attica are set to be done last.

Under the plan, new roofs will be put on the buildings, along with needed masonry work. Contois Masonry & Concrete Contractors of Donovan submitted the chosen proposal, at a cost of \$79,000.

The board also approved a plan from Five Star Commercial Roofing of Hartford City, Ind., for \$40,200.

The board approved a \$135,000 cap on the project to cover contingencies.

Prior to the vote, Trustee Tom Gregory suggested that a specific amount be allotted to each building, which would allow officials to keep track of any cost overruns.

Trustee Nancy Null said contractors can provide that information as they proceed. No action was taken on his

suggestion.

Asked after the meeting what would happen if the cost of the work exceeded the cap, Prillaman said "we're confident that won't happen."

Masonry and roof work will be coordinated, Prillaman said, adding that some beam work will also be needed in some of the buildings.

Work is to begin as soon as possible and is to be completed before December.

The board's plan calls for the buildings to be stabilized, then sold to buyers who will agree to rehabilitate them.

The board, along with members of an ad hoc committee formed to look into options for the buildings, held a public meeting on July 31 to let residents know the plans for the structures and get input from residents. Approximately 100 people turned out for the meeting at Rossville-Alvin Grade School.

In other action, the board unanimously approved an agreement with ConAgra to close part of Creative Way for security reasons.

B-17 Sentimental Journey to land at Vermilion County Airport for tours, flights

Arizona Wing of the Commemorative Air Force at Danville, IL. B-17 Flying Fortress Sentimental Journey will be on display at the Vermilion County Airport, August 11-14.

The most fully restored B-17 Flying Fortress Sentimental Journey a World War II vintage bomber airplane will fly into Vermilion County Airport, offering the public an up-close and personal look at this unique piece of aviation history. The public is invited to tour this airplane inside and out. A \$5 donation is requested to tour the plane. There's even the opportunity for some lucky individuals to actually take a flight in Sentimental Journey and experience this rare aircraft first-hand. Flight opportunities on Sentimental Journey are \$425 per person, tax-deductible with a minimum of five people per flight. The flight will average 45 minutes. Minimum age of passengers is 18 years. For more information and to make reservations call 602-448-9415. Only a handful of these rare birds remain in the world today and most of them are on static display in museums.

Sentimental Journey will arrive at Vermilion County Airport at noon Monday and will be on display until the aircraft departs Friday morning, August 15. It will be displayed and can be toured from noon to 6 p.m. (or until the crowd thins out), weather permitting on August 11; August 12-13, 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. (or until the crowd thins out), weather permitting.

Sentimental Journey is a flying memorial and museum of the men who flew and crewed these airplanes, as well as the men and women who built them more than 50 years ago and especially to the crews that did not return. The B-17 Flying Fortress was famous for the daylight

bombing raids over Germany during World War II and could sustain such battle damage that the aircraft lived up to its name of the Flying Fortress. Out of 12,731 built

there are only about 10 restored and airworthy examples remaining.
