Grant Township board approves multi-township district

Grant and Butler townships will combine assessing duties, following action taken by the Grant Township board of trustees Tuesday afternoon.

In a 3-2 vote, the board approved forming a multitownship assessing district with Butler that will take effect in January 2010.

Grant trustees have considered the issue since June when Butler Township Supervisor Dave Anderson and Clerk Wayne King requested the township assessing offices merge. Anderson said current Butler Township assessor Lois Karlock is not expected to seek reelection. Also, he said, the township's population may have fallen below the 1,000 residents needed for the township to have its own assessor.

The biggest concerns for Grant officials have been whether the move would benefit Grant Township residents and how the multi-township district would be funded.

The Grant board, along with Anderson and King, discussed statutes concerning forming such a district, which Grant attorney Bill Nelson called "horribly written."

According to statutes, once a multi-township district is formed, both assessors continue until one for the new

district is elected but the laws do not specify if a multitownship district is formed immediately upon agreement by the townships involved.

Also, the new district may levy for taxes but there a maximum levy is not set in the statutes.

Trustee Rich Thompson said he has been asked by Grant residents if taxes would go up under a multitownship district.

Anderson responded that if taxes were to increase, it would be because of rising costs, which would affect townships with or without the new district. "Costs may be higher but there would be a reason," he said.

Nelson said he expects the move to cut costs. "I can't imagine that it wouldn't save you money based on the economy of scale," he said.

Anderson pointed out that Hoopeston Area school district could benefit from a multi-township assessing district because one assessor would oversee parcels in both townships, equalizing assessments - and tax dollars - for the schools, which include students from both townships.

With a multi-township district, the supervisors and clerks of both townships will serve on a board oversee-

ing the assessor. Currently, Grant does not have a separate line item in its town budget for the assessor's office separate from the town budget. The board plans to implement a line item for the 2009-10 budget that will allow them to transfer that money to the multi-township assessor's budget and Butler officials will do the same. At the same time, both will decrease the amounts budgeted for individual township assessing needs.

After that, the board of the multi-township assessing district will create its own budget and levy its own taxes.

Trustee Dave Ervin made the motion to create the multi-township district, which Dale Lithgow seconded. They, along with Supervisor Bill Boose, voted in favor of it, while Thompson and Trustee Mike Eckersley voted against the district.
