A strategic plan for Hoopeston Area schools is missing a piece of the puzzle, according to Danville Area Community College official.

Dave Kietzmann, DACC vice president for instruction, has worked with Hoopeston Area's board, administration and faculty on a strategic plan since 2006.

At Thursday night's Hoopeston Area School Board meeting, Kietzmann told the board that while the district has "done a pretty good job of gathering information from internal stakeholders," it now needs to "go to some external constituents" in the form of parents and community groups to get their take on local schools.

Kietzmann suggested that HA hold an open community night where residents of the district may come and express their views. He suggested board members could also do one-on-one conversations with members of civic groups to which they belong.

Like school officials and staff, the community should weigh in on what things the district does well, and which need improvement. Of those things that could be improved, a priority list should be formed and, from that, ways to accomplish those goals, he said.

Kietzmann offered to help with a community meeting, and board President Mark Wagoner took him up on his offer, telling the board that they need to look at their schedules to come up with a meeting night, preferably before Christmas, and invite district residents to share their views. Wagoner also suggested the district might use its website to get more opinions.

In unrelated business, the board approved the estimated 2008 tax levy of \$3,131,250, an 8.7 percent increase. District treasurer Don Dean said the levy needs to be high...just in case. "The chance of us getting 8.7 percent is about nonexistent," he said. However, he added, "if you levy four percent and property comes in at six, you lose two percent."

Last year, Dean said, the district levy was 9.1 percent, but Hoopeston Area actually got three percent. The previous year, the levy was 9.8 percent, but HA only got one percent.

With an 8.7 percent levy, the tax rate would only go up eight cents, Dean said. That translates into \$24 on a \$90,000 home.

The board is expected to review the levy at its October 16 meeting and approve it in November.

In other business, Superintendent Hank Hornbeck said the six-day enrollment figure, on which state aid is based, shows a loss of seven students over last year's six-day figure.

On the sixth day of this school year, Hoopeston Area had 1,292 students. Since the 1992-92 year, Hoopeston Area's enrollment has declined by 423 students, with a loss of more than 50 students in school years 1994-95, 1997-98, 1998-99, 2002-03 and 2005-06.

In unrelated business, the board:

• Learned four seats will be open in the April 7 school board election. The first day to circulate petitions for positions is Oct. 26. Betty Richards was appointed as the district election official.

•Heard from Hornbeck, who thanked the City of Hoopeston for its contribution of \$30,000 towards middle school roof repairs. The city gave the school district the money from Tax Increment Financing (TIF) funds.




