Hoopeston to host household hazardous waste collection

Collection to benefit Vermilion County, other East Central Illinois residents

Hoopeston has been chosen as one of the fall collection sites for household hazardous waste.

"This is very good news East Central Illinois residents," Lynn Wolgamot, Vermilion County Recycling Coordinator said, "because Vermilion County has not been selected as a site since April 2005. Most of the calls regarding 'where can I recycle...' involve hazardous household items that are collected by the Illinois EPA."

Wolgamot urged residents from any part of the state to start saving their items for this special, expensive to hold, collection, which will be held from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 8 in the Hoopeston Area High/Middle School parking lot.

Volunteers from Beta Sigma Phi Sorority and the Presbyterian Church will be working the collection along with others.

Advance notice for this collection is being given so that east central Illinois residents can start getting items ready.

"I know gas is high right now, but if everyone who needs this collection can make the effort to go to Hoopeston, or better yet, carpool with someone else, please do so," Wolgamot said. "Start talking to your friends, coworkers, and family about getting these materials out of your homes, and to Hoopeston, on November 8. Don't wait until the last minute. Vermilion County is only selected for this collection every three to five years, so the opportunity doesn't come around very often."
