The event will be held at Lincoln Park in Danville, on Saturday, Oct. 11, with music from 10 a.m.-7 p.m. The event promises more music, more fun, and a lot more money raised. The concert is free, but a donation of food or money is strongly suggested. All donations will go directly to the Danville Area Food Pantry.

The concert will feature the return of all four bands that performed at the original concert: Deeper Blues, Doc Ashton & the Root Canals, Phaze II, and the New Kingdom Christian Church Choir. In addition, the event will include performances by Fifth World and Urban Squirrel, both from Chicago, and local favorites The Goodfellas, and Benny Jenkins and Flathead Six.

Fundraising activities will include numerous gift basket raffles, 50/50 raffles, special auctions, and various gift items available for purchase. Larry Weatherford will emcee the event, with special appearances by food pantry director Chuck Brooks and several surprise guests.
