Bennett said a soldier's life is not easy, deprived of simple pleasures, such as playing PlayStation games with friends. The hardest part, he said, is being taken away from families.

"Why would anyone do that," he asked, answering his own question by telling assembled guests that it takes a special kind of person to enter the military.

Bennett joined the Army in July 2001 because "I thought it would be a good place to find direction." He enlisted for four years but "I actually fell in love with the way of life."

After Sept. 11, 2001, Bennett said he knew he would be going to Iraq. There, he remembered that while Operation Desert Storm was in force, he never gave thought to the soldiers fighting there. "It hurt my heart that I never thought about what they were going through," he said. He then realized that that was why he was in Iraq, "so people (in America) could sleep at night."

Holland said he decided to enter the Marine Corps after watching on television as the second plane hit the World Trade Center on Sept. 11.

The Iraq War is the first fought with an allvolunteer military, which "says volumes about the men and women in today's forces," he said.

"The way I was raised is that I was not special," he said. "The way I was raised is that I was no better than anyone else."

Joining the military changed his thinking. "It takes a special person to go into the military," he said. "They make lots of sacrifices."

Holland remembered that after 9/11, many vehicles had flags and yellow ribbons on them. Driving from Danville for the ceremony, he said he saw only five flags or ribbons on passing autos. "As time as passed, we've traded those vehicles in, we've taken the stickers off," he said, urging the crowd to "remember veterans on more than Veterans' Day.

Students also participated in the program, with music by the high school chorus and band and readings by Katelin Sheppard and Chelsea Rowe.

Traditionally, Hoopeston's remembrance has been held in McFerren Park. However, earlier this year, the school district was granted a waiver allowing school to be in session on Veterans' Day. Local veterans' organizations backed the measure but hoped schools would include programs teaching students about Veterans' Day.
