Hoopeston Health Center honors three at October open house

In late October Hoopeston Regional Health Center opened the second phase of their construction project. This project, the second of two, included a new entrance on the south side of the building, a new radiology suite, a new conference room and a new housekeeping storage and office area.

Phase one of the project, which was opened in 2007, included a new Laboratory and Purchasing Department.

At the open house Russ Leigh, the health center's Board President, presented two certificates of recognition for contributions made to the facility.

Dick Doyle was the first to receive recognition by Russ. For Doyle's longstanding contributions, of nearly 20 years on the board, the new radiology suite was official named the "Dick Doyle Radiology Suite". A bronze plaque, placed outside of the new suite, was unveiled at the start of the open house.

The second award for recognition was given to Raymond and Winifred Ervin for spearheading the fundraising campaign to build a new helipad for the helicopters that land to transport patients to other facilities. The helipad, which was a critical need, was completed shortly before the open house. The Ervins, in memory of their daughter, Marti Ervin, asked that memorial donations be made to the project. Along with donations from the Ervins, the facility received additional donations from Lois Roberts, Janet Haggerty, Barbara Hatley, Jamee Masengale, Leon and Pat Polson, Rick and Diane Lazzell, N.C. & Koeli Goel, Jennifer and Lloyd Morts, Anna Sawyer, Judy Teran, Jerry and Cathy Douglas, Sharon Drennan, Hoopeston Area Healthcare Foundation, Carle Foundation, Women Making a Difference and First Presbyterian Church.
