Health department offers walk-in flu clinics until vaccine gone

The Vermilion County Health Department will offer seasonal influenza vaccinations on a walk in basis until their vaccine supply is depleted. "Rather than holding scheduled clinics that will tie up staff for long periods of time, we have decided to offer walk in clinics," said public health administrator Steve Laker. The health department has given about 3,000 flu shots since their flu clinics opened at the first of October.

As of Tuesday, November 25th, adult (18 and older) flu shots will be available on a walk in basis at the health department's Danville facility, 200 South College Street on Tuesdays and Fridays from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. and 1:30 to 4 p.m.

Please note: the health department will not be open on Friday, Nov. 28 or Friday, Dec 26.

Walk in clinics will continue until the health department's supply of seasonal flu vaccine is depleted. Cost is \$32; Medicare Part B is accepted, but the card must be presented at the time of immunization. The health de-

partment cannot bill private insurers, but does have an agreement with Health Alliance Medicare supplement HMO 20/PPO 10, and anyone with insurance can receive a receipt if they wish to seek reimbursement from their carriers.

Flu shots for children are by appointment only.

The flu season normally begins in November and continues into late winter. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Illinois, Indiana, Wisconsin, and Michigan are among 21 states and Puerto Rico reporting sporadic influenza outbreaks as of the middle of November. "It is not too late to get a flu shot", Laker says, and, "In addition, we encourage everyone to practice good health habits, such as washing hands frequently, covering sneezes and coughs, and taking other steps to reduce the risk of getting seasonal flu."
