### Council asked to purchase land for housing development

Hoopeston stands to lose housing development project, valued at over \$2 million, if the city council doesn't purchase land for it.

At Tuesday night's Hoopeston City Council meeting, VISTA volunteer Jean Minick, who has spent the last year working on the workforce housing development, presented a petition to the council, asking aldermen to consider purchasing 31 acres of land formerly owned by the Hoopeston Industrial Corporation.

According to the petition, HIC verbally agreed to sell 10 acres for the first of the three-stage development for \$6,500 per acre, but then approved selling the property

to an individual. The unnamed buyer has agreed to sell the land at the same price, but only if all 31 acres are purchased.

If the council purchases the land, the Illinois Community Action Development Corporation has agreed to put an option on the property. If all three stages are completed, the state would end up paying \$180,000 of the \$201,500 price tag, leaving a total city investment of \$31,500.

The land could be purchased with Tax Increment Financing (TIF) funds, according to the petition. Each of
