### Plan for engineered barrier goes back to the drawing board

The Hoopeston City Council put on hold again action to place an engineered barrier at the site of a planned motel.

Alderman Bill Goodwine, finance committee chairman, said at Tuesday night's council meeting that the issue has been handled wrongly from the start and, rather than continue, needs to be started over.

In October, economic developer Dana Goodrum requested bids for the planned asphalt barrier be waived to get it moving. Goodwine declined the request, saying he preferred seeking bids with a short bid time.

Bids were received, but, because of the lateness of the

season, work had to be done within a week, before asphalt plants closed. However, there was confusion about where the barrier needs to be placed and the area was not marked. The timeframe was not met so the council opted to use a concrete barrier and sought bids again. This time, only one bid was submitted.

Rather than accept the bid, Goodwine is taking the project back to the beginning, saying specifications need to be tightened. Because of that decision, details of the one bid received will be kept private.

"It's been rather confusing," Goodwine said. Companies that bid on the asphalt project thought there was no need to submit a second bid, not realizing the city was seeking bids for a concrete barrier.

"I believe, even though it's important to get it done, we need to do it right or not do it at all," he said.

Mayor Bill DeWitt agreed with the delay. "It can't be done until early spring now so no need to be in a big rush," he said.

Once the barrier is put in, the city will apply to the Illinois EPA for a "No Further Remediation" letter for the site, at Rtes. 1 and 9. With that assurance, motel developer Shailesh Patel may begin construction on the motel.

The delay didn't sit well with Jean Minick, VISTA volunteer for housing, who has worked with Goodrum, and previous economic developer Shannon Ruh on the motel project.

Minick vented her frustration saying the city has known of the need for a barrier since at least August 2007. "It's 15 months later and we still don't have a barrier in," she said. "We're not getting anywhere."

Minick also complained about lack of progress for a workforce housing project. At the December 16 meeting, she presented a petition to the council, asking the

city to purchase the 30-acre Hoopeston Industrial Corporation site on Rt. 9, then sell it off - about 10 acres at a time - for each of the three phases of the planned housing development.

At Tuesday's meeting, Alderman Bill Crusinberry asked if other sites had been considered for the development that would not involve the city in buying property.
