Hoopeston Regional Health Center hopes to add more services this year, including one that will aid the area's elderly population.

Speaking at the Hoopeston Community Awards Banquet on January 12, CEO Harry Brockus said the center is looking at offering geriatric psychiatry services by July.

Plans are in the works to have a licensed psychiatrist, three counselors and support staff to man the program, which will help seniors cope with such things as Alzheimer's disease, dementia, forgetfulness and depression, as well as other psychiatric issues.

Brockus said the area of geriatric psychiatry services is relatively unmet in the area and that Hoopeston could fill that niche.

Additional surgical services are also being considered. Carle Foundation Hospital is looking at a surgical residency program and Hoopeston Regional Health Center would like to offer its hospital as a place for residents to get experience.

Also, hospital officials are in discussion with two orthopedic surgeons, to offer that service locally, as well as expanding services offered by Dr. David Dillman, who Brockus called "the premier cataract surgeon in the area."

Currently, Dillman does approximately 100 surgeries each month.

In the next two months, the hospital hopes to have a new 16 slice CT scan, an update from the current four slice model. The new machine will be able to scan a patient head to toe in 12 seconds. Those images could be shared with other hospitals in the area, Brockus said.

Brockus reflected on the accomplishments of 2008, which included the addition of a magnetic resonance

imaging (MRI) machine, which is used 15 to 20 times per month. "It's an exciting new service that we offer," he said.

He also talked about the completion of the construction project which revamped the lab, radiology, registration and emergency room waiting room. "It's the first major construction project in a number of years," he said.

There are plans for more construction, with a plan for a new emergency room by 2010. The ER has grown 10 to 15 percent annually, resulting in a need for an expanded area.

Brockus hopes the community will take advantage of new, as well as existing services, at Hoopeston Regional Health Center. "Choose Hoopeston Hospital as your hospital," he said. "I guarantee you won't find better care anywhere. It's a diamond in the rough."

New to the health center, Brockus was named CEO on November 3, 2008 and has found his Hoopeston experience to be a pleasant one. "I've got to say it's been very friendly," he said. "My wife and I look forward to being here for many years to come."

He has been especially impressed by the people he has met. "The people in that hospital love that hospital and love Hoopeston," he said. "The people in the community love that hospital."

Although he takes his job seriously, Brockus showed a sense of humor during his talk at the banquet. "If you ever want to find me to ask about a healthcare question or anything, you can find me at the Friday Night Auction," he said.
