U.S. Rep. Tim Johnson 'extremely disappointed' in stimulus

WASHINGTON, D.C. U.S. Rep. Timothy V. Johnson issued the following statement in reaction to the House Democratic Leadership's outline of an \$825 billion economic stimulus plan. The plan is scheduled to be voted on in Congress this week.

"I am extremely disappointed that a Congress that began with a message of hope and bipartisanship has so quickly unraveled into what I believe is a plan created in secrecy, constructed without consultation and destined for failure.

"The leadership has bypassed the normal committee process, ignored the opinion of economic experts and steered a course far different than that initially set by President Obama, which itself was far from perfect. The leadership's plan essentially takes a bad proposal and makes it worse.

"The bedrock of any stimulus must be tax relief. I support measures that reduce the tax burden on our families, that give small businesses incentives to create jobs and retain employees, that give people incentives to buy homes and energy-efficient products and that make permanent the MT patch, among other things. These ideas have been presented to the
