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

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## Special council session called for planned affordable housing

Hoopeston is getting a second chance at a workforce housing development.

Mayor Bill DeWitt called a special meeting of the Hoopeston City Council at 6:30 p.m. Monday to hear representatives of Illinois Action Community Development Corporation and Windsor Development speak on the proposed \$3.5 million affordable workforce housing development.

Representatives spoke at the February 17 council meeting and are expected to present similar information at Monday's meeting, said Dana Goodrum, Hoopeston's economic developer.

The council was asked last Tuesday's meeting to approve a resolution earmarking up to \$400,000 in Tax Increment Financing or in-kind money for infrastructure in the housing development. Alderman Jeff Johnson made a motion to do so but no one seconded his motion.

After the meeting, housing officials had considered dropping Hoopeston as a site but with the second presentation, the city gets another chance to keep the project, which is expected to kick off with 24 single family homes.

If the council does not pass the resolution, Hoopeston will lose the development project, Goodrum said. "\$3.5 million for our community would be incredibly impactful, not to mention we have a serious need for affordable housing for single families and for seniors in our community," she said.

The presentation is open to the public.

### Hoopeston Area tables tri-party contract for clarification

A contract among Hoopeston Area, Rossville-Alvin and Bismarck-Henning school districts is expected to be voted on in March if language issues are clarified.

Hoopeston Area School Board tabled action on the contract at its meeting Thursday night.

The contract covers issues pertaining to Rossville-Alvin students since the district deactivated its high school.

Bismarck-Henning already approved the contract, which calls for Rossville-Alvin to pay 95 percent of the audited average tuition rate of B-H and Hoopeston Area for each of its high school students.

The original agreement called for Rossville-Alvin to pay 90 percent of the averaged tuition.

Rossville-Alvin is expected to act on the issue at its meeting Monday night.

In other business, the board heard from Superinten-

dent Hank Hornbeck about a new school, Elpis Middle College, an alternative school for students "who don't fit in" at their home schools.

Danville Area Community College, along with county high schools, Regional Office of Education, Vermilion Advantage, Vermilion Healthcare Foundation and Vermilion Vocational Education Delivery System (VVEDS) are backing the school as a way to boost graduation rates.

Elpis, which is Greek for "hope," will offer dual enrollment for up to 25 juniors and seniors. Each student will receive a computer, earn college credit and those who complete the program will have a scholarship to continue at DACC.
