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Hoopeston City Council approves new housing development

In an about-face from its February 17 meeting, the Hoopeston City Council on Tuesday approved earmarking \$400,000 in Tax Increment Financing (TIF) funds for an affordable housing development.

Alderman Jeff Johnson made Tuesday's motion, as he did February 17. Unlike then, when Johnson couldn't get a second to his motion, Alderman Ed Lotz seconded and the council approved the issue 6-1.

The resolution will allow up to \$400,000 of cash or inkind TIF funds to be used to install infrastructure for the \$3.5 million development, which will be located on a portion of the former Hoopeston Industrial Corporation property on Rt. 9.

Christened "Prairie Meadows," the development will include 25 single family homes and a park. Rents for the homes, which will be a mixture of ranch and two-story structures, will be based on income. Funds will come from the Illinois Housing Development Authority and from a private investor who will receive tax credits. Windsor Development of Springfield is the general contracting firm for the project, which is expected to use local contractors and materials.

Plans call for the homes to be sold after 15 years, with current tenants having first right of refusal.

Prior to the vote, Alderman Carl Ankenbrand said he made phone calls to Litchfield, where a similar development is located, and received a favorable review from the community's economic developer.

Lotz told the council that he received a memo from Police Chief Mark Drollinger, who spoke with police representatives in Pana, Beardstown and Litchfield. Lotz read the memo, which cited no increased crime because of or in the developments, although law enforcement officials said developments in each of the communities are fairly new, with homes not near the point of being sold.

Alderman Bill Goodwine was the sole dissenting vote. "I'd be happy to make a comment and get it out of the way," he said before the vote. Goodwine spoke of how, over the last several years, he's seen Hoopeston become rougher, with increased crime and decreased school test scores.

Saying he believes existing residents will move into the new homes, Goodwine wondered, "without good jobs to offer people, will the vacuum of cheap empty houses attract people who will make our community rougher or more gentle?" He reiterated his statement,

wondering if new residents would decrease or increase both the crime rate and school test scores.

In other discussion, the council heard from economic developer Dana Goodrum that Hoopeston will receive \$180,000 in federal stimulus funds for infrastructure projects. The city has until March 25 to review its wish list and submit projects to the Department of Transportation, she said, adding she is applying for other funds from other departments that would benefit Hoopeston.

In unrelated business, the council tabled a request from The Realm of Shard, a medieval role-playing group, to hold a renaissance fair from June 5-7 at McFerren Park. The council is expected to vote on the issue at its March 17 meeting if Shard can show proof of insurance for the event.

The fair will be used as a fundraiser for the American Cancer Society, said Shard member Chris Inman. Admission to the fair will be free but freewill donations will be accepted for the ACS, he said.

Along with Shard "foam fighting" tournaments, the fair is expected to include vendors, medieval actors, minstrels, acrobats and other displays, said Shard member Mark Huckleby.

The men requested use of the park annex for the Shard fighting tournament and the east side of the park, roughly from the horseshoe pits to the Jaycees building, to accommodate vendors who require electricity.

The council also:

• Unanimously approved a \$6,055 bid from T&L Lawncare for broadleaf spraying of city parks and ball fields.

• Heard from Alderman Bill Crusinberry that the city received a certificate from Illinois American Water-works Association for 12 months of compliance with state fluoridation laws.

• Also heard from Crusinberry that some residents have detected an odor coming from treatment lagoons. Crusinberry explained that odor sometimes gets trapped under ice then the lagoons freeze, then surfaces during thaws. Also, he said, lagoons are handling more wastewater from Hoopeston Foods, which is "having their best year ever. According to (CEO) Tad (Ballantyne), when times are bad, people eat more beans." • Listened as Crusinberry talked about water main breaks along Rt. 1. Officials hope to put shut off valves along the mains there, in part to help Hen-
