Hoopeston Area district hires business/transportation head

A familiar face is returning to the Hoopeston Area school district in a new role.

Mark Eighner was approved at Thursday's board meeting as district business manager/transportation director.

Eighner, a former school board member, was one of 20 candidates who applied for the position, said Superintendent Hank Hornbeck. The list was pared to four, then two candidates who interviewed with the board.

Eighner brings much experience to the position. "The board was looking for an individual with a strong financial background and a strong personnel background," Hornbeck said after the meeting. "Mark's track record of successfully working with and managing people is a plus. Also, he has been responsible for financial matters as a business unit manager and cost accountant specialist at FMC in Hoopeston."

Eighner's most recent position has been at Horizon Hobby, Inc. in Champaign as an international supply chain manager.

"We are happy to have Mark as a new member of the Hoopeston Area CUSD #11 team," Hornbeck said.

Eighner's new position will combine jobs currently held by business manager Don Dean and transportation director Darrell Brown, both of whom are retiring.

In unrelated business, the board heard from Hornbeck that the district is expected to receive more than \$700,000 in federal stimulus money.

Funds will be broken down between Title I, which

The Title I program is set to receive \$197,000 for fiscal years 2010 and 2011, while the special ed program is slated for \$320,000 for 2010, Hornbeck said. Money will be used to supplement existing services, he added.

Part of the money is to make up for the state aid shortfall and make payments for next year, with an estimated \$130 per-child hike in state aid.

Area receives may not be known until the checks actually arrive. "The figures seem to change almost daily," Hornbeck told the board.




