Projects included: trees to boarder the soccer fields in Hoopeston, finishing the Discovery Garden at the Bismarck Henning Elementary School, park improvements in Bismarck by the Woman's Club, trees to be planted at the Catlin Park, perennials to be planted in three of Catlin's cemeteries, new landscaping at Catlin High School, Southwest Elementary School in Tilton, Northeast Magnet School in Danville South View Middle School by

the Caring 4H Club, and Oakwood Elementary School. All of the school projects had a little extra funding from other sources.



Four neighborhood associations within Danville were awarded funds for planting perennials in community areas and one is planting a community flower and vegetable garden. Employees at ThyssenKrupp Presta will be sprucing up their building entrance also. Potomac and the Potomac Community Foundation have applied for larger grants to enhance their community park and water areas and KVCB grants were added to those projects.

The village of Fairmount will be ordering new flower pots this year and the Woman's Club of Fithian will be landscaping their park. Sidell will be ordering new containers for their downtown area also. The Georgetown Public Library board wants to purchase a bench with their funds and Georgetown Township is putting in a big vegetable garden to help feed seniors and others.

Ridge Farm is planting perennials this year and Muncie is ordering self watering equipment for their flower pots on poles. The Vermilion County Animal Shelter will have volunteer Nancy Gulick planting perennials in the one area left to plant while the Vermilion County Nursing Home has the Catlin United Methodist Church as their guardian angels. A group from the church has been planting all the flowers near the Nursing Home entrance for the past 4 years. Their commitment doesn't stop at planting either. They volunteer to weed, water and dead-head the areas where they plant from May through October. Many hundreds of visitors enjoy the fruits of their labors when they visit Vermilion Manor.

Look for two projects from University of Illinois Extension office. One will be an expanded garden project in the vacant lot by the Danville Public Library and the other will be a project at Northeast Elementary Magnet See KVCB on other side

There's one thing we can all agree on. Spring came late this year and so has the planting season. On the good side, we didn't have a frost and now, we're not apt to. There's plenty of moisture in the soil. So let's plant! • One of the facts of a late season is we are apt to go fro cool to hot days without those perfect days between for little plants to get a head start. So we plant carefully, ⁸ adding water, and we choose the healthiest plants we can find, those that have been watered and fed daily, even in the little packs.

There are several flowering plants you don't want to miss. If you're planting impatiens, try the once called "Watermelon." It's a delicious color. Your garden

should have at least one of the awesome Yoder Brothers hibiscus. They now come in many colors. Be sure to include some of the Proven Winner petunias. This is my third year to have them both to plant in the garden and in porch boxes and hanging baskets. They are very special, bloom constantly until frost and require only feeding and watering to fill your days with their flow-°

Peppers love heat. They may do better planted now than earlier. So, too, do impatiens. Tomatoes will catch up fast with all this moisture in the ground, hot days and warm nights. Bean seeds will come up much faster than they did a month ago.
