## Rossville trustees takes aim at sources of stagnant water

ROSSVILLE—"Use it or lose it" might be used as a slogan for swimming pools in the village.

At Monday night's meeting, the Rossville Village Board unanimously approved an amendment to the health and safety ordinance that adds abandoned or unused swimming pools, along with cisterns and ornamental aquatic garden excavations, to remain open, unfilled or improperly covered, allowing stagnant water to accumulate and promote the breeding of vermin.

Vermin is defined as flies, roaches, mosquitoes, rats or mice, according to the amendment.

In the same measure, it is now illegal to allow refrig-

erators, freezers, washing machines, clothes dryers or stoves with intact doors, locks and latches to remain in the open.

The amendment is effective immediately.

In unrelated action, trustees:

- Will explore the idea of accepting bids to have one garbage hauler for the community. The health and safety committee is researching the proposal.
- Discussed revamping storm sewers on the village's south side, where Norton's Machine Shop, the old Citgo, Merita's and Davan's get flooded after heavy rains.
- Heard from Mayor Terry Prillaman that the planned sale of 115-117 E. Attica fell through.
- Approved re-examining using a broker to purchase electricity. The board recently decided to remain with Ameren because of reports that rates were expected to drop. However, the company is now reportedly seeking a rate hike, Prillaman said.

will have a sausage gravy and biscuit breakfast starting at 7 a.m. until sold out. Events during the day will include the Art on the Dixie show, a gas engine display, venders, car show, home made pie and ice creams and a water ball fight.

The water ball fight is new this year and sponsored by the Rossville Fire District, who encourages folks to form teams to participate.

There will also be garage sales held throughout the village during the day.

The day will climax at 4:30 with the fifth annual running of the Ducks in the popular Dixie Duck Dash. Hundreds of rubber ducks will race down the North Fork of the Vermilion for cash prizes.

Those owning ducks can reenter and those wishing to either purchase a designer duck or rent a Dixie Duck may do so up to one hour before post time.

"This is always a fun annual event," noted Pam Bell, event chairman. "We scaled back a little because of the Rossville Sesquicentennial Celebration coming up in April. We are happy to be working with our fellow Dixie Highway communities."

The Dixie Highway was created in 1914 as part of a tourism promotion to encourage travel between the Midwest and the Deep South. The Western Branch of the route started in downtown Chicago and followed Illinois Route 1 (the historic Hubbard Trail) south to Danville's Redden Square (named for Rossville native and WWI Hero Curtis Redden) where it turned east on US 136 to Indiana. The original dirt road was paved in brick and

then, in 1939, replaced with concrete. An original section of the brick Dixie Highway can still be seen to the west of Route 1 north of Danville.

In Rossville, at least one surviving building was made from reclaimed Dixie Highway brick, and the original concrete mile posts were relocated to the Rossville
