Health department planning in case of worsened H1N1 flu

Vermilion County Health Department is meeting with local leaders this week to discuss planning for the H1N1 flu virus, should it reappear in a more hazardous form next fall.

"With the World Health Organization declaring a full pandemic, we believe it is only sensible to begin talking about what the community may face in the fall and winter months," said public health administrator Steve Laker.

The WHO raised the worldwide pandemic alert level June 11 to Phase 6 in response to the ongoing global spread of the novel influenza A (H1N1) virus. A Phase 6

designation indicates that a global pandemic is underway.

Historically, the emergence of novel viruses like H1N1 that result in global pandemics often first surface during the spring in a milder form, continue to mutate, and then reappear during the fall and winter months with a much higher mortality rate. "It is simply too early right now to know what will happen in the fall and winter," Laker said, "But we know that we cannot wait until later to talk with our community stakeholders and partners about how we will handle the situation."

The health department will host a meeting of its community partners and stakeholders at 1:30 Wednesday, in the County Board Room of the Courthouse Annex. Laker said the meeting will provide an opportunity to let the invitees get a better understanding of the current situation, including the potential for vaccine development and delivery, as well as initiating the discussions and planning that will be necessary for community leaders to be prepared, should the situation worsen in a few months. "We do not have the answers to all the questions this situation is creating, but we do know some of the information our partners will need to put their plans in place, and we want to share that with them," Laker said.

There have been over 21,000 confirmed cases of H1N1 worldwide, with less than 1,000 deaths. Illinois has had over 2,500 confirmed cases of H1N1, and 12 deaths since the virus emerged in early April.
