

Karen has had Crohn's disease for the past 24 years, undergoing several surgeries, as well as taking

medications, many of which have become ineffective.

This year, Karen was selected by the Mid-America Chapter of the CCFA as one of the Honored Heroes for the CCFA Team Challenge Half Marathon in Kona, HA, and Napa Valley, CA.
