

#### HRHC offers new mental health service for senior citizens

Bridgeway, a new department of Hoopeston Regional Health Center, officially opened on Monday, August 3rd. The program is a mental health resource for the senior population.

Bridgeway is an intensive program for the senior population. "We work using group processes designed to help with different issues that are prevalent in the elderly," said program director Heidi McGill. "We will facilitate two groups in the morning, Monday through Friday. Group therapy assists with different coping skills, helps individuals realize they are not alone, and guides them through the process of making changes.

McGill said people who would most benefit from the program might be dealing with one or more of the following issues:

Loss of interest in what he or she normally enjoyed do-

Isolation

Lack of participation in social events

Crying more

Having a difficult time dealing with grief or loss Having a difficult time adjusting to a medical issue

Referrals may come from family members, friends, clergy, neighbors, nurses, physicians, assisted living facility staff, and nursing home staff. "Our main criteria are the individuals need to be able and willing to participate in a group, and retain and benefit from the information they attain," McGill said. "We are really looking to empower people through the therapeutic process."

To begin the process, individuals will make a call to the Bridgeway staff. If the initial conversation leads both parties to believe the elderly person would benefit from the program, a screening meeting is scheduled in the person's home, at their assisted living facility, nursing home or in Bridgeway's office. The next step would be

Group therapy can validate a person, provide a sense of empowerment, and help individuals see that there is happiness left for them. The group process also allows people to help others in the group which gives a sense of purpose and meaning."

Bridgeway can provide transportation as needed. They have a handicapped accessible vehicle and a minivan, as well as a driver on staff.
