Classic film to be shown at Lorraine

CineMajestic LLC will celebrate its first full year of operation of the Historic Lorraine Cinema with the presentation of the cinematographic David O. Selznick classic, Gone With the Wind, starring Clark Gable and Vivien Leigh on October 2-4.

"We'll have the exclusive national play of Gone With the Wind and I'm very excited to finally see this classic," said Joshua Caudle, owner of the Historic Lorraine Cinema. live events, and classic Art Deco historic artwork throughout. Last year, all new seating was installed with an industry-leading five foot wide spacing between rows of seats to maximize comfort and eliminate visual obstruction for films.
