County issued tentative property multiplier of 1.0284

SPRINGFIELD—Vermilion County has been issued a tentative property tax equalization factor of 1.0284, said Brian Hamer, director of the Illinois Department of Revenue.

The equalization factor, often called the multiplier, is the method used to achieve uniform property assessments among counties, as required by law. This equalization is particularly important because some of the state's 6,600 local taxing districts overlap into two or more counties (e.g. school, junior college and fire protection districts). If there were no equalization among counties, substantial inequities among taxpayers with comparable properties would result.

State law requires property in Illinois be assessed at one-third of its market value. Farm property is assessed differently, with farm homesites and dwellings subject to regular assessing and equalization procedures, but



The equalization factor is determined annually for each county by comparing the sales price of individual properties sold over the past three years t the assessed value placed on those properties by the county supervisor of assessments/county assessor.

If this three-year average level of assessment is onethird the market value, the equalization factor will be one. If the average level of assessment is greater than one-third the market value, the equalization value will be less than one. And if the average is less than one-third of market value, the equalization factor will be greater than one.

Assessments in Vermilion County are at 32.41 percent of market value, based on sales of properties in 2006,

the tentative multiplier will be held between 20-30 days after the tentative factor is published in a newspaper of general circulation within the county.

A change in the equalization factor does not mean total property tax bills will increase or decrease. Tax bills are determined by local taxing bodies when the request money each year to provide services to citizens. If the amount requested by local taxing districts is not greater than the amount received in the previous year, total property taxes will not increase even if assessments may have increased.

The assessed value of an individual property determines what portion of the tax burden a specific taxpayer will assume. That individuals' portion of tax responsibility is not changed by the multiplier.
