



# Extended hours offered for in-person absentee, early voting

Vermilion County Clerk Lynn Foster will offer extended hours for in-person absentee and early voting prior to the general primary election on February 2, 2010.

The county clerk's office conducts absentee and early voting for the 59 precincts located outside the city limits of Danville.

The Voting Center, located on the first floor of the Courthouse Annex, will be open from 9 a.m. until noon on Saturdays, January 2, 9, 16, 23 and 30, 2010.

Under a new provision in Illinois law, a voter who wishes to vote absentee need not declare a reason for doing so. Absentee voting is available in person or by mail.

Those who wish to vote absentee by mail should request an application from the county clerk's office as soon as possible after Thursday, Dec. 24. Once the


Rossville Fire Department was assisted by Hoopeston and Bismarck firemen and were on the scene until almost 6:30 a.m.
