The closings leave only one meal site open in Danville and resulted seven people - three from the meals program and four from the social services branch - being laid off.

Additionally, the Hoopeston Corn Cruiser bus route, which runs between Hoopeston and Danville, will have the number of daily trips reduced.

Beginning January 19, the Hoopeston Corn Cruiser route will make only two round trips per day, Monday through Friday, between Hoopeston and Danville.

The morning trip will now make pick-ups at the Hoop-

eston bus stops between 7:15 a.m. to 7:45 a.m. and leave from the Hoopeston Multi-Agency at 7:45 a.m. The morning return trip will leave Danville, starting pick-ups from the Danville Mass Transit Bus Transfer Zone at 10:20 a.m. and returning to Hoopeston by 11:30 a.m.

The afternoon trip will now make pick-ups at the Hoopeston bus stops between 11:30 a.m. to 12:00 noon leaving from the Hoopeston Multi-Agency at noon. The afternoon return trip will leave Danville, starting pick-ups from the Danville Mass Transit Bus Transfer Zone at 2:20 p.m. and returning to Hoopeston by 3:30 p.m.

The fare for the Hoopeston Corn Cruiser is still \$3 each way per person and \$1.50 each way for seniors over 60 and disabled. No reservations are required to ride the Corn Cruiser.

CRIS Vermilion Transit will also provide a curb to curb transportation to those who need this service. Reservations for the service must be made at least 48 hours in advance. Cost is \$4 each way or \$3 for seniors over 60 and disabled.

When funding is restored, CRIS Vermilion Transit intends to reinstate the Corn Cruiser Route back to three round trips per day, Monday through Friday.
