EPA public meeting in Danville to inform on new lead law

SPRINGFIELD—The Illinois Department of Public Health Lead Program is holding 16 meetings around the state to inform the public about the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's new Renovation, Repair and Painting lead law that goes into effect April 22.

Locally, a meeting will be held from 6-9 p.m. Wednesday, March 10, at Robert E. Jones Municipal Building, City Council Chambers, 17 W. Main St., Danville.

The new law requires contractors, property managers and others paid to replace windows or renovate residential houses, apartments and child-occupied facilities built before 1978 to be certified by the U.S. EPA. The new law is intended to protect children

from leaded dust that may result from disturbing lead-based paint.

Common activities like sanding, cutting and demolition can create lead hazards that can be harmful to children and adults. In 2008, more than 5,000 Illinois children had elevated blood lead levels. This new federal law has the potential to significantly decrease childhood lead poisoning.

There is no safe level of lead in the body. Lead poisoning can cause health problems, including decreased I.Q., learning disabilities, kidney diseases, high blood pressure, miscarriage and birth defects.

Computer expert warns of fake internet antivirus program

Editor's note: The following information was submitted by Teresa Sollars of The Computer Works, who said people in the area have been the victims of the program.

Security Tool is a rogue security application, which is a fake antivirus program which is generally installed without user permission. Security Tool is a clone of Total Security and System Security, which are also both fake antivirus programs and both have very similar characteristics to SecurityTool. Security Tool hopes to trick the user into thinking that it is a real program by using various methods. Security Tool hopes to also scare the user into purchasing the program by displaying fake virus scan results. Security Tool is fake and doesn't work.

Security Tool will tell users that their computers are infected and will use tactics to convince the user to pur-

chase it. It will also use other tactics, such as the use of pop ups to warn the user. However, the program itself doesn't work to remove viruses. It has a website which it uses to advertise the fake program. It may also use pop ups to convince the user to purchase the program. Doing so compromises the users credit card. SecurityTool is similar to its previous clones in that it uses randomized filenames to make it hard to find.

Common symptoms and characteristics of Security Tool and other rogue security programs include:


1. Security Tool is generally installed without user permission through a trojan horse.
2. Security Tool uses pop ups and fake virus scans to scare the user.
3. Security Tool website is unprofessional, with fake testimonials and fake awards.
4. The payment website for Security Tool looks suspicious.

5. Various antivirus and system programs on the user's computer will stop functioning.

To make sure you keep your computer running like it should, keep your antivirus & antispyware programs updated and run them every couple of days. Do not give credit card information to sites that you aren't sure of. If all else fails, call or take your computer to your computer store.
