Study: when it comes to healthy, Vermilion County isn't

A national survey shows that when it comes to health, Vermilion County ranks in the bottom 10 percent in the

The study, done by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation and University of Wisconsin's Population Health Institute, ranks Vermilion County at 96 of 101 counties surveyed. One county was not included in the study.

The report includes health outcomes and health and socio-economic factors.

In the category of mortality, Vermilion County ranked 91st, with premature deaths—defined as years of potential life lost before age 75—Vermilion County had 9,201, compared with a target value of 5,694 and a state value of 6.987.

Twenty two percent of residents were listed as having poor or fair health, compared with a target value of nine percent and a state value of 16 percent. Nine percent of babies born had low birth weight. The target value of the category is six percent, while the state value is eight percent.

According to the study, 24 percent of county residents smoke, compared with 21 percent in the state and a target value of 17 percent.

Vermilion County also came in over targets for adult

birth rate and preventable hospital stays.

viders, with 79 per 100,000 residents, compared with 128 in the state. Only 76 percent of diabetic Medicare patients received screenings to test A1c levels, compared with 78 percent statewide. Hospice use, at 15 percent, is less than half the state's 33 percent.

The study showed better results in the categories of percent in the state.

Socio-economic factors, which may correlate to poorer health, show the county has a high school graduation rate of 76 percent, compared to 80 percent statewide. Twelve percent of residents have college degrees, compared to the state rate of 29 percent.

The county's unemployment rate, defined as those 16 or older who are unemployed but seeking work, was listed at eight percent, compared to seven percent state-


